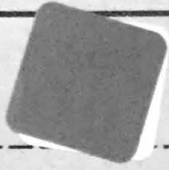

The following is the text of the subject report submitted by an individual who does not fall into the "credible witness" category; but due to the fact that the individual was so adamant about what he had observed, it might be worth looking at. The incident was reported through Valley Ops:

"An orange object was seen to do circuits around the Liverpool area. 2 Tomado ac were believed to approach it and follow it before it "out-maneuvred" them at 2030 hrs. Then a Nimrod was believed to come in the area to "search" for the orange object, giving up the search at 2125.

The caller said the orange object had flames coming out of the front with burning bits falling off it, the object was silent.

Liverpool was contacted by Valley Ops and they said no Tornadoes (not my spelling) or Nimrods were in the airspace that evening"

Considering that this was supposed to have happened at around 2030hrs (dark) on a Sunday evening (28 Jan 01), the observer has remarkable powers of ac recognition and I would be interested to know why half the RAF seems to have been flying around on a weekend outside of the display season! Seriously though, grateful [S 40] if you could run some checks with your Gp colleagues to see if any types of Tomado (AD and Off) or Nimrods were in the area at the time. You also need to do a quick check with the CRC(s) to see if the ASACS saw anything.

3. A reply by 26 Mar 99 would be appreciated.

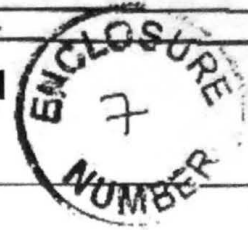

UFO REPORTS - 15 & 22 FEB 99

You asked me to research these UFO reports to see if there were any AD involvement, interest or corroboration of sighting.

AD ACTIVITY

- Have checked AD activity for the periods concerned. the results are as follows;

15 Feb 99 (Period 1015-1045hrs).

- UKCAOC. No record of AD activity over the duration of the UFO report. Particularly, there was no QRA(I) activity, no routine UK AD flying and no exercises in progress between those times.
- RAF Neatishead. RAF Neatishead were not involved in any AD, exercise or air activity during the period of interest.
- RAF Buchan. RAF Buchan were not involved in any AD, exercise or air activity during the period of interest.
- Radar Investigations. Due to the source of this report and the description of the observed traffic, further investigation was carried out by examination of recorded radar data from the following sources:
 - RAF Buchan Reference Telecon Catterall/Tolley 220915ZMar99 – RAF Buchan radar information examined for the time and area of the reported sighting by Buchan ops staff. No traffic matching the report was seen. VHS video tape en-route to HQ11/18Gp, radar tape impounded.
 - LATCC West Drayton Reference Telecon Stocks/Tolley 221012ZMar99 – LATCC radar information examined for the time and area of the reported sighting by AIS staff. No traffic matching the report was seen. VHS video tape en-route to HQ11/18Gp, radar tape impounded.
 - SCATCC Prestwick Reference Letter PWK/20/1/ATCC dated 15 Mar 99 – SCATCC radar information examined for the time and area of the reported sighting by SO2 ASACS Ops1. No traffic matching the report was seen. VHS video tape with HQ11/18Gp, radar tape impounded.

CONCLUSION

- There was no AD activity at the time of the report.
- No exercises involving RAF AD units were in progress at the time.

Recorded radar data replays do not support the sighting.

- Report of no further interest to HQAD.

22 Feb 99 (Period 2030-2100hrs).

- UKCAOC. No record of AD activity over the duration of the UFO report. Particularly, there was no QRA(I) activity and no exercises in progress between those times.
- RAF Neatishead. RAF Neatishead were controlling 4 x Leeming F3s (SAMSON 1-4 – 11 Sqn) in area 7 (Lincolnshire MTRA) at the time of the reported sighting. These ac are discounted from contributing to the sighting for the following reasons;
 - The Westerly boundary of Area 7 is over 35nm East of Littleover.
 - Any traffic inadvertently straying West towards Littleover from Area 7 would infringe the E. Midlands Airport CTZ, which would be a serious matter and subject to a special report.
 - The F3 ac were not stationary, and
 - They were not dropping flares.
 - Notwithstanding the above, F3s do not show steady lights when carrying out Practice Intercepts, only flashing anti-collision strobes.

CONCLUSION

- There was no QRA(I) activity at the time of the report.
- No exercises involving RAF AD units were in progress at the time.
- There was AD training flying in the Lincolnshire MTRA, but this could not have produced the sighting observed.
- Report of no further interest to HQAD.

NOTE

- I have impounded 3 radar tapes upon your authority for the purpose of examining recorded radar data for evidence of the 15 Feb 99 sighting. If you agree, I will release each radar tape once I have received the VHS video of the area/time of interest. Please advise.

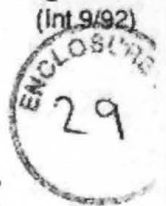

UNUSUAL AIR PHENOMENON - 5 Oct 96

1. After efforts to analyse the various sightings of unusual lights which occurred in the early hours of 5 Oct 96, I believe that three separate phenomena can be identified; each is briefly described below with a possible or probable explanation.

LIGHTS IN THE WASH AREA

2. Stationary and generally red/green/white flashing lights to the south east at about 40-45 degrees above the horizon; no reliable height or range could be determined. The lights were observed by Skegness and Boston Police between 0214Z and approximately 0600Z (daybreak); similar lights were observed from the MV Conocoast (approx 8 miles SSE of Skegness from 0345Z until daybreak. The lights observed from Skegness were captured on video which is being sent to RAF Nectishead, however, the result is believed to be of poor quality.

3. The fact that these lights were observed from three separate locations high above the horizon and in the same general direction, without corroborating radar data, suggests a distant celestial source. Venus rising may be a possible explanation since the planet can appear bright, coloured and to flash in certain conditions.

LIGHTS TO THE NORTH OF MV CONOCOAST

4. Stationary red, blue, green and white flashing lights to the north and 'very high', 40-45 degrees above horizon. Lights observed from the MV Conocoast between 0245Z and approximately 0600Z (daybreak).

5. The lights were observed from a single location at sea in the same direction as those at para 2. They appear to have been seen from a distance over the horizon at an angle above the horizon. These lights were not the result of any attempt on 5 Oct, but remain unidentified.

PERMANENTLY IDENTIFIED

6. General sightings of unidentified returns, without flight SSR, observed on the Giltay radar at 0210Z until 0300Z from Boston and Weddington on the Weddington APC radar.

7. These sightings were most likely from a point of geographical location. The sightings were in Boston which were identified as being from a point of air track with the Weddington radar.

ultimately associated with lights in the wash of E Anglian area. This church spire is known in aviation circles as the 'Boston Stump' and appears occasionally on some radars in certain radar propagation conditions.

8. Conclusion. The prolonged sighting of stationary coloured flashing lights reported by the Skegness police on 5 Oct 96 had no significance for the integrity of UK Airspace and no associated air vehicle was detected by civil or military radars.

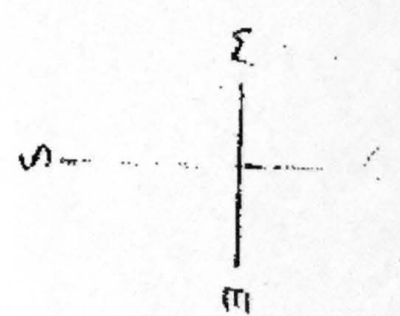
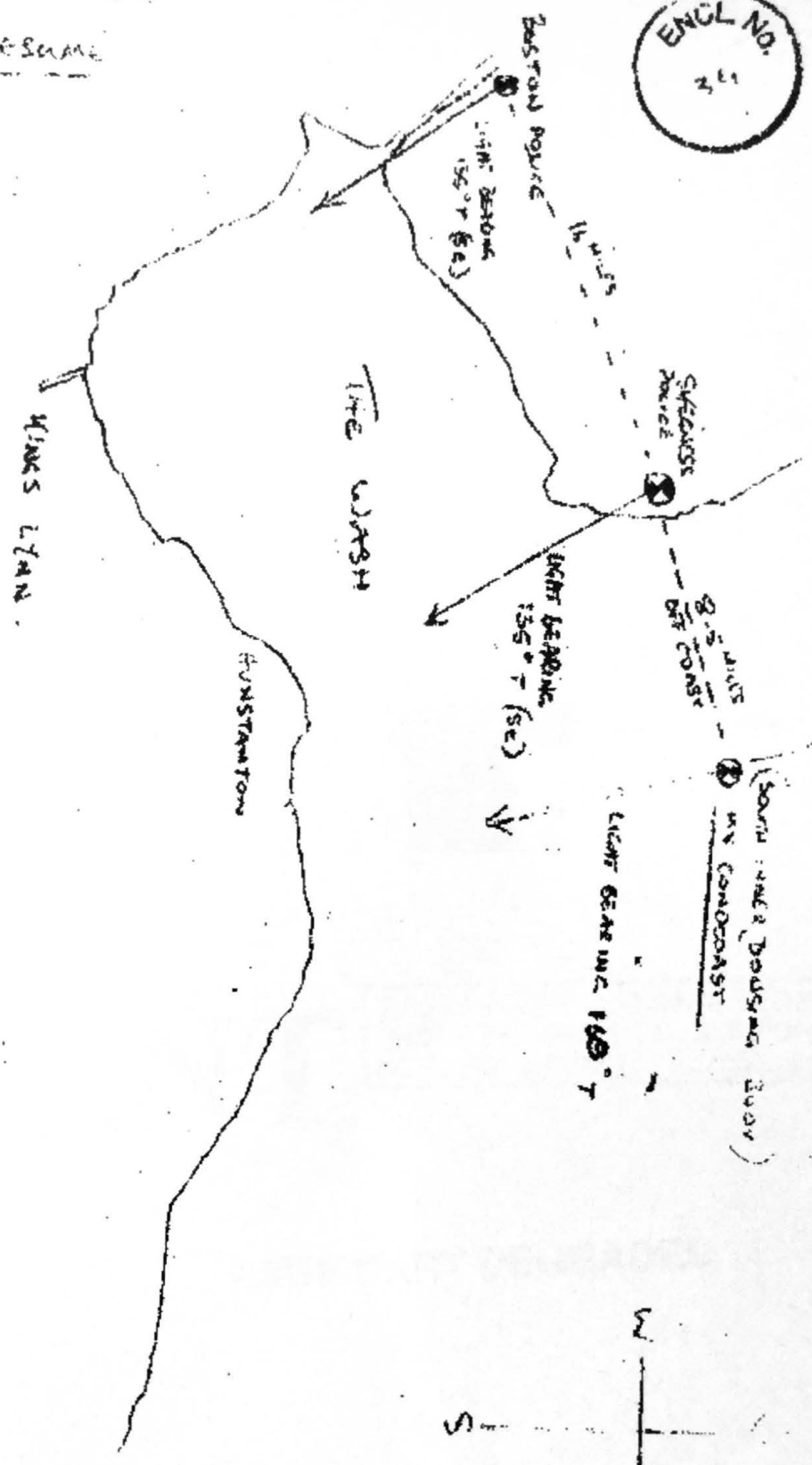

Dear Michael,

I am very concerned about an incident that occurred off the east Anglian coast recently, involving a visual unidentified flying craft sighting which was correlated by various different military radar systems. I have attached, for your information, copies of some recent press reports.

From these press reports it would seem as if the unidentified flying craft was seen by the crew of a tanker; the crew of a civil aircraft; police at Skegness (who took a video), and police at Boston. Simultaneously, the object seems to have been picked up on military radar systems at R.A.F. Neatishead, R.A.F. Waddington, and R.A.F. Northwood, together with systems at London and at Anglia radar.

What strikes me as incredible is that no aircraft were scrambled when an uncorrelated target was picked up so close to the coast. This raises for me, serious issues about the way in which we police the U.K. Air Defence Region (U.K.A.D.R.). Given that we have Tornado F.3 aircraft based at R.A.F. Leuchars; R.A.F. Coningsby; and R.A.F. Coningsby, should not one of these bases have had air defence aircraft on Quick Reaction Alert (Q.R.A.), and should a launch not have been ordered? I am also unclear as to the involvement of R.A.F. Kinloss in Scotland, home of our Nimrod Maritime Patrol Aircraft.

A story seems to have been put around that the radar systems were picking up Boston's church tower! Although "ground clutter" can give spurious returns around certain radar heads, my understanding is that the locations of such areas are well known and that such an event is unlikely to be repeated on so many different radar systems. Some of the Air Traffic Control radars might have difficulty with ground clutter, but Air Defence radar systems and their skilled operators should know the difference. This "explanation" also fails to take account of the visual sightings.

Naturally, all sorts of rumours are circulating: no Q.E.4. aircraft were available at R.A.F. Coningsby, which is just a few miles from the Wash; the R.A.F. wanted to scramble aircraft but were overruled "at the highest level"; the video taken by the police has disappeared into the bowels of your Ministry's Main Building. While I am interested in finding out what was seen, my primary concern stems from the absolute shambles that such events seem to cause. The R.A.F. are supposed, or so I believed, to be responsible for keeping a watchful eye on activity in the U.K.A.B.R., but seem to have no idea as to what is going on. Do they have no standard procedure for such incidents? They had enough time to think about it, because the object was on radar for upwards of seven hours! These concerns remain, even if there is a prosaic explanation for this specific incident.

I could think of countless other questions that concern me based on the points I have raised in this letter and in the various press reports, but I will confine myself, in addition to the above, if you will answer the following questions in respect of the unidentified flying craft sighting that occurred on 4th./5th. October in the vicinity of the Wash, and subsequently reported to your Department:

1. If you will detail the role played by these military establishments who picked up on their radar systems or were otherwise involved in events, and if you will comment on the video of the sighting seen by your Department by the Boston police?
2. Why no aircraft were scrambled to investigate the unidentified flying craft seen by the police; the crew of a civil aircraft; and the crew of a tanker on 4th./5th. October, given that at least three military establishments reported having detected the unidentified flying craft on radar?
3. Whether it is the R.A.F.'s standard practice to ignore sightings of unidentified flying craft which are correlated by radar, or whether there is a requirement to investigate such phenomena by scrambling aircraft?

I look forward to your reply with great interest.

Out of this world

This is the transcript of the conversations between coastguards, RAF stations in Norfolk, Scotland and London, police and North Sea tanker Conocoast when strange lights were seen in the night sky at the weekend. It is the recording taken at Plymouth Coastguard headquarters:

0314 Skegness police: "We can see a strange red and green rotating light in the sky directly out east from Skegness. It looks strange as it is stationary and there is no aircraft sound in the area."

0325 RAF Kinloss: "Northwood have a radar contact bearing 021 degrees at 18 miles. It looks to be stationary and there is no way of establishing its height but it must be quite a size to be visible from Skegness."

0331 Kinloss: "Neatishead now confirms a couple of radar contacts in the area but no echo. They seem to be stationary. There are definitely no military aircraft in the area and no notified civil flights should be there."

0406 Conocoast tanker: "We have these lights in visual now. They are flashing red, green and white. Cannot identify it as an aircraft as it looks stationary and it is approximately one mile high."

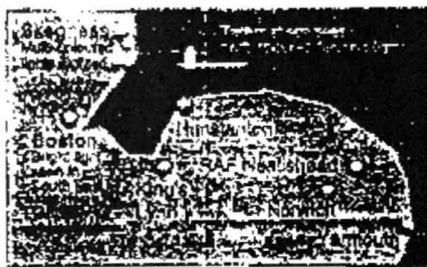
0411 Plymouth Coastguard: "Did you see from which direction it appeared?"

Conocoast: "No. It just appeared and is stationary."

0533 Kinloss: "Neatishead say it could be obscured by the weather."

0540 Plymouth Coastguard: "I don't think so as we have visual contact."

0550 Kinloss: "Well, Neatishead and Northwood report that there is no transponder on this



object and therefore no means of interrogation. It is obvious that whatever it is it does not want anyone to know that it is there. Also Neatishead report its position as directly over Boston."

0604 Conocoast: "It is still stationary and flashing red, green, blue and white. It looks very high, north of this, and there is no engine noise."

0617 Plymouth Coastguard: "Can you get radar coverage as the RAF are very interested and may require it later."

0627 Kinloss: "Neatishead are keeping a line of watch like a cluster on the radar."

0647 Plymouth Coastguard: "Conocoast can you give us an update?"

Conocoast: "We can see two lights flashing green and red."

0651 Plymouth Coastguard: "Give us both bearings of the two lights."

Conocoast: "There is one stationary, perhaps 100 degrees true and the other at 180 true, the lights were 3000 visible with the naked eye and both match the same characteristics flashing red, blue, green and white."

0517 Boston police: "We can see the lights towards the south-east and seems about 10 degrees in the sky. It is just a bright light to 0521 Kinloss: "Neatishead are running a track on this and cannot explain it. If they are helicopters they are fast approaching the coast. Their endurance as it is well over the limit the first report let alone how they were up there before they were sighted."

0557 Conocoast: "We can still see the lights and they are on their original bearings. Flashing the same colours but they are dimmer and dimmer."

0708 Flight Lieutenant McFarlane, Kinloss: "We had a report from Northwood that our flight had also reported strange lights in the area. They fit exactly what was reported on the ground, multi-coloured, flashing, stationary lights."

0731 Flight Lieutenant George, Northwood: "The echo is still on our screens and we cannot explain this at all apart from it being a meteorological phenomenon. Our agents do not have visual sightings also. The division that reported these lights was 40 miles away at the time. All very strange."

The truth was out there. But even agent Mulder of the X-Files would find it hard to believe. The great East Anglian UFO mystery was solved last night - and turned out to be just a storm and a church tower. The weekend sightings of colourful flashing lights over the Wash captured the imagination of would-be X-Files sleuths across the region. Letters and telephone calls flooded into the EDF after the sightings, which coincided with the appearance of a mysterious object on radars.

One theory was that the culprit was planet Venus. But Norfolk RAF investigators have now found logical explanations - and have ruled out the possibility of little green men peering down on us. Flight Lt Keith Sweatman, of RAF Neatishead, said: "We now know that the radar trace was Boston Shire - the church tower at Boston. And the weather people said that the coloured lights in the sky coincided with an electrical storm over the Wash."

"You do get weird experiences with electrical storms, and they can produce lots of different colours. The tower church tower would have been ruled out if it had been picked up by a more advanced RAF radar, which can computer enhance images. But the air traffic control radar did not have similar facilities, and operators jumped to the conclusion that it must have been linked with the flashing red, blue, green and white lights seen by the Ladder Concoran."

Following the weekend sightings, an investigation was launched by the Ministry of Defence to ensure they did not pose a threat to national security. That has now been concluded.

The mystery is expected to be cleared up over the next couple of days when experts at RAF Neatishead view video footage of the lights. They are waiting for the video to arrive after being sent from Boston police. Flight Lt Sweatman stressed they would be keeping an open mind.

Take it not so gently, Bentley, as the ETs close in

THE LAST time RAF Bentley Priory was called on to defend the county it was to fight the Luftwaffe in the Battle of Britain.

But the next time it goes into action it could be to defend our shores from enemies from rather further away than across the English Channel. In fact the invaders could be from outer space.

Discovery of the possibility of life on Mars and the success of the film Independence Day have increased interest in what would happen if hostile green men invaded Earth.

And the responsibility for defending Britain from flying saucers would fall squarely on the shoulders of the 400 military personnel at the top security base off Uxbridge Road in Stanmore.

As headquarters of No 11/18 Group it controls Britain's air and maritime defences under the command of Air Vice-Marshal Cliff Spink CBE.

"We would co-ordinate the defence of an invasion by air," confirmed Flt Lt Sandy Burton, a spokesman for the base.

"We would receive orders to defend the country and we would mobilise forces. We don't have any aircraft here but we would pass orders to bases around the country.

"Of course what actually happens is secret and I cannot really comment on that," he added.

What lies behind the armed guards at the Priory doors is revealed to officers at the base only on a "need to know" basis.

But it can be taken for granted that co-ordinating air and sea defences across the country would involve the latest hi-tech equipment - even without the prospect of facing attack by highly-advanced aliens.

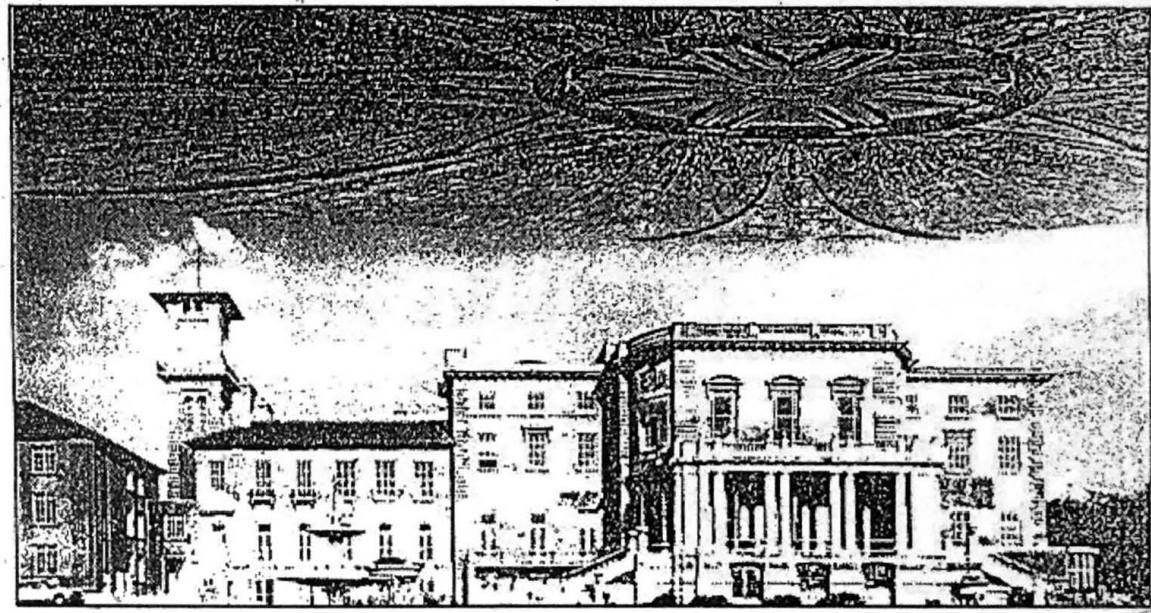
Officially the armed forces do not have any plans for a response to an extra-terrestrial invasion.

"I am not aware that there is a contingency plan for a force arriving from another planet," said Ministry of Defence spokesman Nigel Sergeant scornfully.

"It is regarded as a totally hypothetical situation - and nobody would have any idea what form such an invasion would take."

Investigations of UFO sightings are so low on the ministry's list of priorities that they are the responsibility of just one woman as part of her other duties.

But as conspiracy theorists and viewers of the X Files television programme know, the military is traditionally reticent when discussing extra-terrestrials.

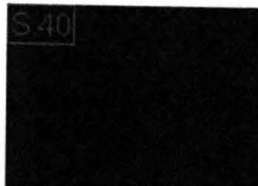

MARTIN REDMOND PQs - 'UFOs'

1. I attach at Annex a list of PQs (26 in total) tabled by Martin Redmond for written answer concerning, directly or indirectly, UFOs. Given that the House prorogues on Thursday 17th October, the Parliamentary Branch has asked for the answers to be with them by midday tomorrow, Wednesday 16th October.

2. Given this sort of timescale I am concerned about the implication of answering all of the Questions on an individual basis. It could be that the sum total of the answers might provide more information than can be assumed if each is dealt with in isolation. I therefore recommend that as a first step they should all be answered with "I will write". MOD lead Branches as allocated (see also para 3 below) should ensure that this action is completed and that the Parliamentary Branch has the necessary answers by noon on Wednesday 16th October. The background note could simply refer to the large number of questions tabled, the fact that the House prorogues the next day, there is insufficient time to obtain the information requested and, more importantly, the need to assess the collective worth of what it is proposed to say.

3. Sec(AS) is not offering to answer all of the PQs but, it seems to me, there is a need to co-ordinate our replies - hence this minute. Annotated against each of the PQs on the attached list is the Branch allocated to lead by the Parliamentary Section. However, some of the questions have been wrongly allocated and,

where this is the case, we have corrected, as appropriate, in bold type. All addressees of this minute will, however, have an interest in some, or all, of the PQs tabled.

4. Having provided an interim reply, I suggest that the next step should be to decide whether any of the questions/answers might be linked and draft letters accordingly. The drafts should be circulated for comment and only when everyone has signified that they are content, and we have decided whether there is a need for one or more letters in total, should they be forwarded to the Parliamentary Branch for Ministers' signatures. Again, I believe it would be appropriate for me to act as the focal point/coordinator.

5. We have considered whether any of the questions might be answered substantively in time to meet the Wednesday deadline. At first sight it could be argued that by answering PQ2117 with a straightforward, factual answer, we could nail once and for all the myth that Rudloe Manor continues to have some involvement in UFO matters. However, the Question covers the last 10 years and there is a related Rudloe Manor Question at PQ2130. We therefore need to look at the sum total of what we intend to say.

6. The usual timescale for following interim PQ replies with substantive letters is five days. We do not, therefore have much time to play with and it would be helpful if you could fax/CHOT your draft replies for comment asap.

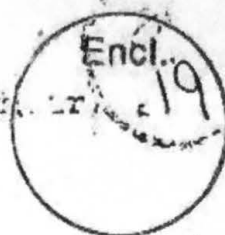

In Reference A guidance was given on the action to be taken by units on receipt of reports of unidentified flying objects.

I am directed to inform you that approval has now been given for a change of procedure in dealing with correspondence with the public about reported UFO sightings. All reports will be examined as heretofore so that defence implications, if any, may be investigated. However, with the limited resources now available to deal with correspondence from the public on the subject of UFOs, the Department can no longer undertake to advise observers of the probable identity of the object seen. It is therefore necessary for Item Q, which asks if a reply is requested, to be deleted from the form on which reports are made. All reports received by units should, as in the past, be forwarded to AFOR for normal circulation action.

Reports will be acknowledged by S4f(Air) to the observer with a short proforma letter.

Any enquiries from the press should, as before, be referred to the Ministry of Defence Press office.

It will be necessary to continue to categorize reports where possible for the Department's records of UFOs and the monthly summary currently prepared by HQ Strike Command (STOOC) will therefore still be required.
