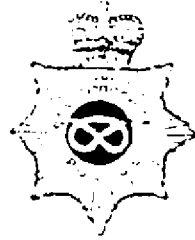

Further to our telephone conversation and as requested, I am writing this letter in order to put some of our discussion into a documented format.

The case discussed has been one of the three occurring in almost the same area during the course of the past three years. From these incidents, there are two samples available from two incidents. Somehow, I find it rather difficult to put it to sheer co-incidence. As I explained, I do have samples from the latest incident on which certain tests have been carried out. The preliminary evaluation of the trace elements are somewhat too complex to be that of a meteor. This is my belief. I was also sent the result of the analysis of the sample of the second incident, plus some of the sample itself. I have to dig out that particular report from my files.

As I explained, I am prepared to have a mutual cooperation with you on the grounds of an official agreement to exchange information. So many times in the past by good intention and naive trust or belief in certain establishments I had very little results.

I am enclosing herewith a copy of the correspondence with NSA/USC as you requested.

The other area of my research involves animal mutilations, possible human mutilations. It is my knowledge that individuals are being abducted in this country, although the race we are dealing with in Europe and UK in particular is a different from the race in America. It is my knowledge that the alien bases exist, and they exist on Earth. Despite what you might think the evidence is more over-whelming than a dismissal without proper study of the cases. The type and the possible modus operandi of the type of the UFO crafts seen often, and their size in general does point the finger the an Earthly base/s.

With regards to information you required about our American researchers, I think you would agree with me in saying that first we have to know each other somewhat more, also, I have to know what kind of UFO information you require. I trust that for the mutual benefit of both of us, hopefully we might be able to establish some grounds with which to work.

Whilst thanking you in advance for your kind reply, I look forward to hearing from you.

The documents are classified because their disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause exceptionally grave damage to the national security. Because the documents are currently and properly classified, they are exempt from disclosure pursuant to the first exemption of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. section 552(b)(1)).

In addition, this Agency is authorized by various statutes to protect certain information concerning its activities. We have determined that such information exists in these documents. Accordingly, those portions are also exempt from disclosure pursuant to the third exemption of the FOIA which provides for the withholding of information specifically protected from disclosure by statute. The specific statutes applicable in this case are Title 18 U.S. Code 798; Title 50 U.S. Code 403(d)(3); and Section 6, Public Law 86-36 (50 U.S. Code 402 note).

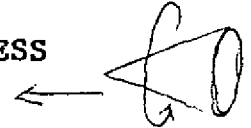
