First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, MOD does not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting. We believe it is possible that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. We could not justify expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond our specific defence remit.

With regard to your particular observations, I have looked back through our sighting report files and can confirm that we received no reports of 'UFO' sightings for 28 January 2001 or for 4 April 2001 from Kent. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised air activity.

Thank you for your letter dated August 10th acknowledging my report of a U.F.O. in this area on July 27th 2000. Notwithstanding explanations of natural phenomena and aircraft lights I feel that I should send you my account of the series of events which occurred on the evening of July 27th.

- ① TIME; Between 8-8/30 P.M.  
DIRECTION OF VIEW was south at an elevation of 30°-35° with 8x32 binoculars.
- ② WEATHER; "Crystal clear" - no haze or cloud whatsoever and a very bright evening. The evening moon was low and large in the southern sky and the whole of disc of the moon was visible, although the left half was in darkness the right half of the disc was highly illuminated by a bright setting sun.
- ③ I live near Liverpool airport and as the evening was warm and clear I was viewing aircraft traffic and my attention was drawn to a small floating sphere, not unlike a child's balloon, drifting on warm air currents. I followed its path and it merged with the U.F.O.
- ④ The object was solid, possibly DARK KHAKI in colour and shaped like an inverted plant pot (SEE SKETCH). I could see two intense RED lights, not unlike navigation lights, on either side of the main structure.
- ⑤ As I was viewing it the object suddenly illuminated itself with very bright - highly intense beams of RED-GREEN and PALE YELLOW lights rippling down its side, rather like the lights on a fruit machine.

⑥ This sequence stopped abruptly and then the lights started to pulse rapidly again in a Set pattern. (A) A YELLOW triangle from the top of the object to its base. I watched the object for about 15 mins before my vision started to become blurred and I had to lower my binoculars. I did not see the object arrive or leave. It was stationary at all times - not the slightest movement - and no obvious sign of a source of power to keep it in position.

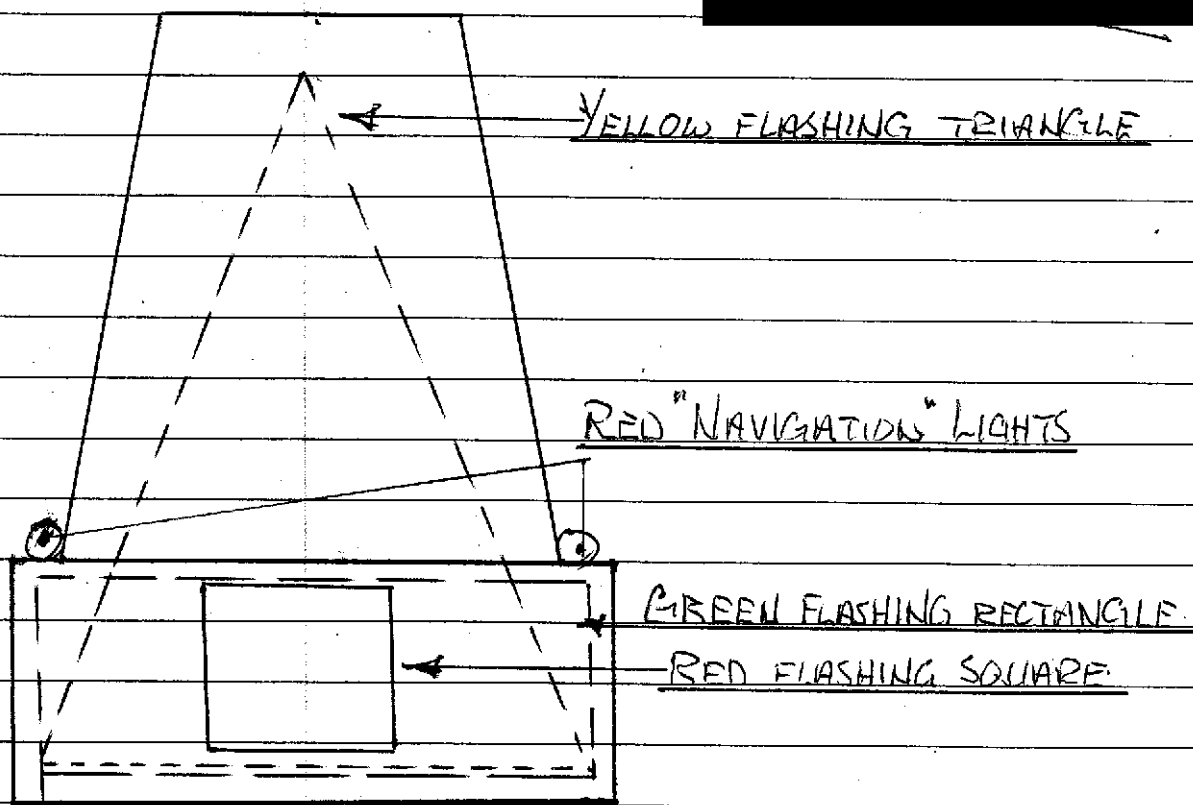
It appeared to be positioned over a small refinery complex which is situated across the river Mersey, not far from where I live.

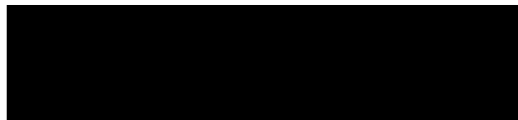

ROUGH SKETCH OF OBJECT





## Report Concerning Unidentified Aircraft.

Date, Time: 23/7/2001, c.11.00 am

Location: The back garden at home, on the edge of Perton, 6 miles West of Wolverhampton, South Staffordshire (approx. 8 miles S-E of RAF Cosford, 23 miles N-W Birmingham Airport).

Weather: warm and sunny, very clear; blue sky partly covered with (low) slow moving cumulus cloud.

### My Circumstances:

I was writing while sitting on a bench. I paused to watch a high-flying passenger aeroplane low-down on my left, travelling roughly in a NW-SE direction. I watched its vapour trail and then, after it had lost its vapour trail, continue until approximately overhead. I then noticed the second item as described below.

### Setting:

I was immediately taken by this object as it was very different to the passenger plane. It appeared much lower as it constituted a much larger image size. It was nearly overhead when I saw it and, as it was coming towards me, had presumably flown from over the house. It appeared to be travelling very fast in a roughly North-East South-West direction. Unfortunately my sighting was very brief, lasting perhaps only 3-4 seconds and ending as it disappeared above the cloud, but it was otherwise very clear and unobstructed.

### Description:

My immediate reaction was of a rocket, which then changed to something resembling a large 'missile' (the former was probably more accurate). It was difficult to see detail because of the speed it was going. Its basic appearance was of a reasonably long and thin aircraft, of which only the body was really visible.

Initially I noticed the underside which appeared to have two outer parallel lines which appeared to protrude (or were simply darker), with it being slightly concave in the middle. It may also have been darker, possibly circular, at the far end. As it passed above me, and I saw it side-on, the sun reflected on its surface momentarily - an area of it glistened and appeared clearly metallic, but not coloured (it appeared dull or greyish overall). The reflection was not along the whole side but just in one small area (*in the manner of sun on water*).

It may have been uneven or had markings on its side but it was blurred and simply travelling too fast to tell. At no time did I notice any shape regarding either its nose or tail, or any signs of wings. All I was aware of as it entered into the clouds was its rapid speed.

Immediately afterwards I heard the distant 'rumble' and echo of the passenger jet, but this was not interrupted, magnified or altered by any other sound. I waited to see the object emerge from the clouds but did not sight it again. It left no trail and appeared to make no noticeable noise whatsoever.

It happened so quickly that I doubt whether anyone else nearby could have spotted it (including my parents who were working in the garden at the time).

Height:

This is difficult to estimate as I am not familiar with the height of clouds. The initial passenger plane, which flew across a clear part of the sky, was distinctly visible and not at the very high altitude of some aircraft. I can only describe the height of the clouds as typical for a warm summer's day.

My Conclusion:

Initially I thought of something like space-debris, but the aircraft appeared to be lower than this so this may not be the correct explanation. It appeared to be travelling in a line as an aircraft (*ie., not up or down*).

Myself:

I am not a trained observer, although I look at the sky more than most. I have long been interested in astronomy and bird-watching. I have seen many types of aircraft; *ie.* an increasing number of passenger planes at home overhead, sometimes low-flying jets, as well as those from air shows at a nearby airbase. Unfortunately, I am not particularly familiar with meteorology. But this was very different to anything I have seen before.

*I would like to inform you about a further two UFO sightings that we have received.*

*1st report is from Liverpool and is dated 7.7.01 time 17.00 hours:*

*It was around 5pm my wife & I were walking with our two children, when I pointed out a plane to my 2 year old boy, following the vapour trail back in the sky, just stationary in the sky was what I can only describe as an orb (like the ones seen in Mexico), we watched it for about two minutes, when I said to my wife well go back to our house and get our camcorder, we rushed back, but by the time I got outside again the object was nowhere to be seen.*

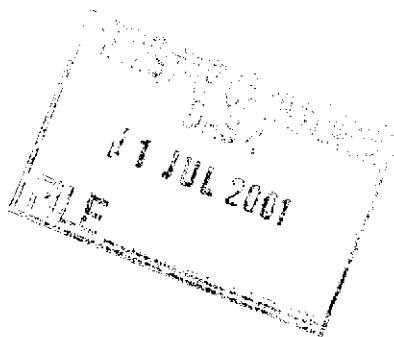

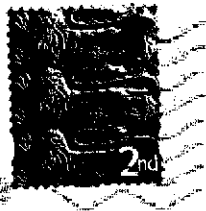

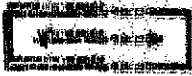

Dear Sir,

I wonder if you would be kind enough to help me identify a sighting of an unidentified flying object that I witnessed with a member of my family tonight?

Today's date is Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> July, the time 10.15pm. My location was in North West London, facing what I believe to be a westerly direction. I stood looking out of my kitchen window when I noticed what I first thought the planet Venus. It puzzled me because it was not in the position that I knew it should be, this made me stare a little harder at it. (Note - I used to be an amateur astronomer, so I am aware of the positions of planets etc) I watched the object for a few minutes before I realized that it was actually moving. I quickly ruled out conventional aircraft because it was far too high and there was also no other flashing lights etc. There was also no sound. It was very similar to a satellite that flew over London a few months ago. The object was exactly like a star and moved very slowly, more slowly than the satellite previously mentioned. I also ruled out a comet because I have also seen them a few times, this was controlled and very near the earth's upper atmosphere. I watched the object for at least 20 minutes before it finally disappeared in cloud cover. I also watched the object through a pair of binoculars and it was definitely not a star, I can confirm this by the distance it traveled in 20 minutes.

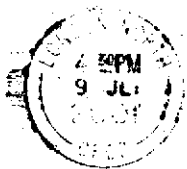

Thank you for your recent letter in which you have reported three sightings of 'unidentified flying objects' between December 2000 and 22 February 2001, all of which you believe are incursions of UK airspace.

As you will be aware from previous correspondence, the integrity of the UK's airspace in peacetime is maintained through continuous surveillance of the Air Policing Area by the Royal Air Force. Any threat to the Air Policing Area would be handled in the light of the particular circumstances at the time and it might if deemed appropriate, involve the scrambling or diversion of air defence aircraft.

With regard to your particular sightings, I can confirm that we received no other reports of 'UFO' sightings in these locations, on the dates you gave. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised military aircraft.

In paragraph (b) of your letter, you say that the 'craft' was in 'what you have been assured is an air exclusion zone'. Military aircraft do not generally train close to civilian airports and this is what may have been meant by an 'air exclusion zone'. However, Woolwich and Greenwich are within the Control Zone for London City Airport. Civilian aircraft will therefore be seen in the area and will be under the control of London City Airport air traffic controllers. If you have any concerns about this air traffic, you may wish to contact the airport direct.

Sorry I haven't forwarded anything recently, but I've been rather busy, (the recording studio rebuild is going very well & we should re-open hopefully in the Summer). Hence enc: is a CD-ROM of some of our recent cases we think might be of interest to your dept:

- a) Rendlesham 2000\* (actually on the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the original case)... This to our knowledge is from the only footage available in civilian hands. This object was clearly visible for over 20 minutes. We were actually there & witnessed it with at least 30 other people inc: one of the original witnesses from Bentwaters (original Rendlesham case) in 1980 & many well known researchers. We investigated this sighting on the night & have made a thorough investigation in collaboration with local research groups to date. In our opinion it remains 'unidentified'. It was a clear incursion of the UK's airspace and would have posed a danger to legitimate civilian & military aircraft & was in close proximity to a former airbase (Bentwaters) esp: as it was at a very low altitude & presumed (to our inquiries) to have been below the radar ceiling.
- b) Woolwich Dec'00\* (picture 1). On the 29<sup>th</sup> Dec'00 a triangular 'UFO' was observed for several in minutes over the Millenium Dome in Greenwich. The following photograph was taken. This was witnessed by 3 workmen & myself (who took the photo from the studio roof). Our research shows this was no kite, balloon, advertising blimp etc.... the 'craft' was under obviously intelligent control. Clearly below 200 feet in altitude and in direct breach of what we have been assured is (or now was?) an air exclusion zone. Both in a sensitive area & at a sensitive time. It is also very close to the flightpath of the Docklands City Airport. In our opinion posed a danger to local air traffic & was thus of UK defence significance.
- c) Woolwich Feb'01\* (picture 2). On the 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb'01 a bright luminous orange spherical 'UFO' was observed in almost the same location as the previous sighting. It was witnessed by myself and a workman on site. (I was able to take this one photo, I keep a camera with me at all times to photograph the development of the studio re-build). This object was witnessed for around a minute and exhibited fast 'controlled (?)' movement, also for a short time remaining stationary while in close proximity to the Docklands City Airport, then a very fast, low trajectory before disappearing into *thin air* on a clear day with very good visibility. I only just managed to catch it on film. This 'UFO' was in my opinion posed a danger to air traffic in the vicinity of the Docklands City Airport. The nature of this sighting rules out natural phenomena such as bollide meteors & ball lightning. This object remains unidentified.

triangular ufo over the Millenium Dome Greenwich

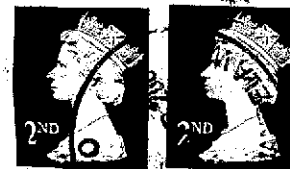


Picture 2 Feb'01  
spherical orange ufo over Woolwich, near D.C.A.

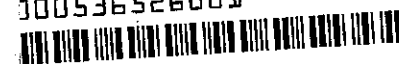

I am writing with reference to your report of a sighting of an 'unidentified flying object' on 4 April 2001. The report was passed to us by Grampian police via the Aeronautical Information Service (Military) at RAF West Drayton as this office is the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to 'UFOs.'

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, MOD does not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting. We believe it is possible that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. We could not justify expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond our specific defence remit.

I should wish to assure you that the integrity of the UK's airspace in peacetime is maintained through continuous policing of the UK Air Defence Region by the Royal Air Force and we remain vigilant for any potential military threat. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that on 4 April 2001 the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised air activity.

I am writing with reference to your report of an 'unidentified flying object', seen on 16 February, in the vicinity of Scarborough. This Department is the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to 'UFOs' and your letters to RAF Leeming and Humberside Police have also been sent to us for reply.

I will answer your questions in the same order as your letter.

**Could you clarify this sighting?**

As you will be aware from previous correspondence, the Ministry of Defence's interest in reports of 'UFOs' is limited to whether there is any evidence that UK airspace has been compromised by authorised air activity. Unless there is such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting. We believe it is possible that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. We could not justify expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond our specific defence remit.

With regard to your particular sighting, we are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised military aircraft on this day.

**Was the military flying exercises?**

The only military flying activities notified to the Ministry of Defence are major exercises and low flying training (below 2000 feet), where a specific booking is required. Individual sorties at medium or high level and small Squadron exercises are flown depending on individual training requirements and it is therefore not possible to say if there were any military aircraft in the area. I can confirm, however, that there were no major exercises taking place and there was only one aircraft flying at low level. This was a search and rescue Sea King helicopter operating in the general area between 17.45 and 18.45.

**Have you had any more sightings reported from anywhere else on the night in question?**

We received three other reports for 16 February and these are summarised below.

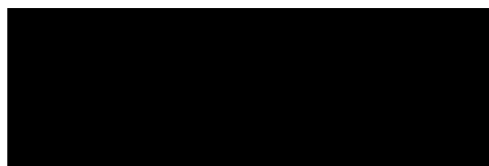

You may recall that I wrote to you on 12 April concerning your report of a sighting of an 'unidentified flying object' on the evening of 28 January and your belief that there were also RAF jet aircraft in the area.

Military aircraft do occasionally conduct training at weekends and the activity you describe could have been fighter affiliation training, where one aircraft assumes an attack role and the others manoeuvre to avoid it. However, without checking with every fast jet Squadron in the RAF, the RN and the United States Air Force, which are based in the UK, it is not possible to be certain whether there were any fast jets flying on the evening of the 28 January. Nevertheless, as you thought the aircraft you saw may have been Tornado F3s, I have checked with the RAF Stations where these aircraft are based and they have confirmed that there were none flying on the date you gave.

I am sorry that I am unable to assist any further with your enquiries.

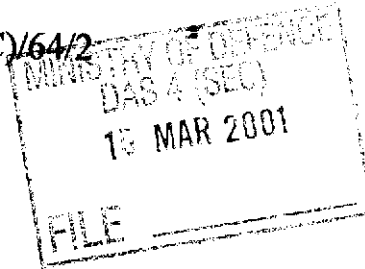

Thank you for your letter of 05/03/01. I must admit that I was pleasantly surprised to receive a reply regarding my original contact with the RAF.

In reality I would not expect to have my sighting corroborated by any official body, however this does not mean that I did not see what I believed I saw on that evening. While I appreciate that it may not be cost effective to further investigate this incident, I feel it is worth sending you this, which is my account of the incident I witnessed, along with my 15 year old son, if for no other purpose than to give you some food for thought.

At approximately 20.20 hours on the evening of Sunday 28/01/01 I was out near my house walking my dogs. I was returning to my house and was walking down the grove when a movement in the sky caught my attention. At an approximate 45% angle, directly in front of me I could see an object moving left to right, at a slow but noticeable velocity..The object appeared to have an orange glow, and I surmised it may be Skylab, which I had not at that time seen. I quickly put the dogs inside the house, called my son, and collected our two pairs of binoculars.

When we got back outside, perhaps 30 seconds had elapsed,. and now the object was moving towards us, in a clockwise direction, and was clearly not as far away as I had first thought. I estimated the object was at an altitude of between three thousand and six thousand feet and traveling at perhaps three hundred knots.

When viewed through the binoculars the front of the object was glowing orange. As the object passed within a mile of us I could see bright orange pieces falling from it. My thought at that time was that this was an object that had suffered damage, possibly from a collision or possibly from re-entry. Due to the circular course it was following it was clearly an object flying under some sort of control. Only the front of the object was visible to me as there were no other lights showing and I would estimate the size of the visible portion to be perhaps thirty yards across. The object disappeared from sight for a period of approximately one



to two minutes when it reappeared behind us on what would be the opposite side of a circular flightpath .

It is worth noting that no noise was audible despite its relative closeness to us. Just about then we heard aircraft approaching. I turned to see where the noise was coming from. From the north east I could make out two aircraft approaching and they were following a flight path that would bring them directly over head and in the general direction of the object my son was still observing . The planes were flying in what I would describe as a tactical formation, with one flying slightly behind the other and roughly eight hundred yards apart, and at an altitude of between two and five thousand feet.

Given my basic knowledge of RAF aircraft gained over visiting many air shows around the country I have no doubt these aircraft were military jets. I thought it to be extremely unusual or unlikely that RAF fast jets would be carrying out an exercise over Liverpool on a Sunday night therefore these aircraft may be interceptors, making them almost certainly Tornado F3s.

As they passed overhead although the night was very clear I could not honestly say they were F3s for certain ,but they certainly sounded like them. Soon however , I was to have a large chunk of doubt removed. The jets now were clearly on course to intercept the flightpath of the object which was now roughly five to ten miles away, and its altitude had risen to between five and ten thousand feet.. They flew on towards it, picking up speed and height, and it looked as though they might bracket the object, but as they approached it, the object suddenly reversed the direction it was flying in, away from the approaching aircraft. The two aircraft clearly accelerated towards the object, changing direction to pursue it, and it was about now that I began to think. What if the thing turns on them and they can't hack it, what then? If this was an example of one of these "black" projects, then it was obvious that for it to be able to maneuver as it was doing, given the significant damage it had sustained, it was employing a kind of technology I had never heard of, and it was a very capable craft. If it was terrestrial in origin, then why would it fly away as it was doing , and then I thought, if it is terrestrial or otherwise, is it flying away to avoid more damage i.e. the damage had been inflicted by the interceptors earlier ,and they had caught up with it as it was waiting for some kind of backup or rescue..I began to think about rules of engagement in such circumstances, and also about the vehicles we send into space, and do we send them up with any kind of defensive armament?

Anyway, the three craft flew a very short way in line before the object simply shot upwards, and the jets also climbed vertically in pursuit. They were lost to sight then as they all went up through one of the very few clouds visible in the sky that night. By the speed the jets climbed I would say they almost certainly must have used afterburners,, as I have seen Hawks, Tornados , F15s, SU27s etc all going

vertical, and the Hawks do not climb at such a rate as this pair were doing. Afterwards the heavy kerosene smell you get at displays was noticed by my son and I, which may seem unlikely, but there was very little wind that night. Perhaps thirty or forty seconds elapsed when to my relief I saw one of the jets coming back down with the second following soon after.

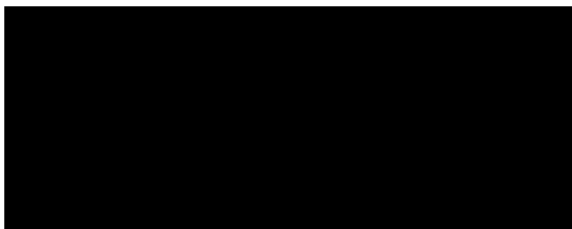
The jets flew a couple of circuits of the area taking perhaps another five minutes, before they departed in the general direction they had first appeared from. As they flew off I could hear another, larger aircraft approaching. My first impression was that it may be a commercial flight as our house is directly under one of the main flight paths into Liverpool airport, Before it flew over us however it banked sharply and began a tight circuit and my belief is that this aircraft was a Nimrod engaging in a search for the object using its electronic detection systems. The silhouette of the aircraft and the noise of its engines and the position of its engines would tell me it was a Nimrod. The aircraft continued to circuit the area for some fifteen to twenty minutes before it flew towards us, with all its forward lights on. As it approached our position it turned all of these lights off leaving only its running lights visible. It then began to gain altitude gently and continued in straight flight in south westerly direction, until it went out of sight.

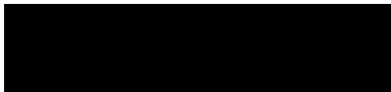
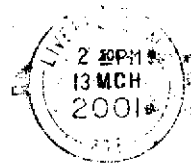
I have already obtained feedback from the CAA regarding air traffic that evening and all they could confirm was that two Ryanair Boeings had been in the area over Liverpool that evening.

I do not expect you to confirm or deny any of these facts but I would ask that you give them some serious thought.

Whether this object is of terrestrial or extra terrestrial origin one thing is for certain. We as a nation or we as a race had better get our fingers out as we are definitely second best to who ever had built this craft.

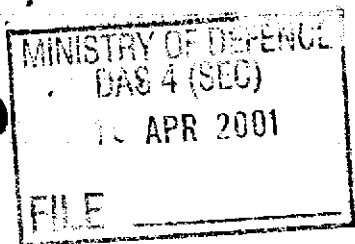



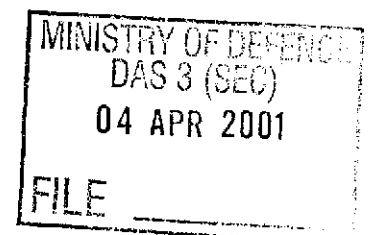

**UNUSUAL LIGHTS SEEN NEAR CHIPPENHAM, WILTSHIRE ON  
TUESDAY 03 - 04 - 2001, 0235 HOURS.**

At 0235 hours, Tuesday 03 April, 2001, whilst in the garden of my home at [REDACTED] Chippenham, Wiltshire ( I'm an MoD Police officer currently stationed at [REDACTED] and as a result of many years of shift work, I tend to be a bit of a night owl so to have a cup of tea in my garden at this time of night is quite the norm!) I saw a pair of bright red lights moving from the SouthEast, heading towards the NorthWest, crossing just to the North of Chippenham. As the lights came parallel to my position I could see that they appeared to be approx 100 meters apart, with the trailing light 10 - 20 meters higher than the leading one. Each light had a double flashing pulse, approx 1 second apart, with the trailing light flashing first, immediately followed by the leading light. Judging the altitude is fairly difficult, but I doubt if they were much higher than 1000 feet, and were certainly less than a kilometre from my position. A small jet aircraft was following the lights approx 50 meters (maybe less) behind the trailing light. Visibility was excellent, with almost no cloud around at the time. There was a bright moon, and I could clearly see the silhouette of the pursuing aircraft and it's navigational lights. I was struck by the fact that I could clearly hear the engine of this aircraft (it was a very clear, still night) but not of multiple aircraft. I could see the background sky between the red flashing lights, which ruled it out as a solid object, and whereas I could clearly make out the silhouette of the jet, I could make out no solid objects in the vicinity of the red lights! It was very clear that both red lights and the following aircraft were on the same perspective because all maintained comparable speed, distance apart, and direction of travel. I observed the objects and the pursuing jet for at least 10 seconds before they passed from my view towards the NorthWest.

I am writing to you in the hope that you may be able to assist us in one of our current investigations concerning reports, from the public and media alike, of a possible plane crash in Northern Ireland in mid-February.

The incident occurred on the evening of Tuesday, February 13th, when members of the public contacted the Royal Ulster Constabulary after seeing what they thought was an aircraft, trailing smoke, crashing onto Benaughlin Mountain, near Kinawley in County Fermanagh. Following these calls, RUC and Army personnel conducted a search of the area, with negative results.

The incident was reported here in the Republic on RTE radio news bulletins that night, and again early the next day. However, I've yet to hear what the conclusions reached by the Northern Ireland security forces were. In order to put this case to rest, I would be very much obliged if you could please let me know the following.....

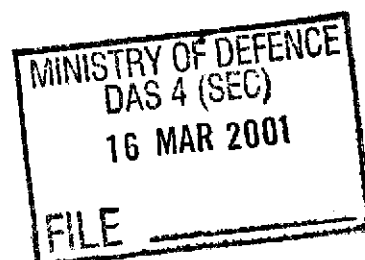
1. Was anything found?
2. Did astronomers at Armagh Observatory - or elsewhere - conclude that it was a meteorite, etc., so that I can contact them for further details? If this conclusion *was* reached, *who* reached it?
3. Can you let me know which other agencies, besides police and army units in Northern Ireland, were either alerted to this situation or took part in assisting in the search? (Hospitals, mountain rescue, etc.?)
4. Could you please check and let me know which agencies in the Republic were also alerted to this incident? I understand from news reports that members of the public phoned the Garda (police) in County Cavan, but which bodies were alerted or consulted by the security forces in Northern Ireland? The Garda Siochana, for example, or the Irish Aviation Authority, the Republic's airports / Air Traffic Control centres, military, and so on?
5. Without revealing sensitive operational details, could you let me know if this incident was in any way connected to the sealing off of land near Tempo, County Fermanagh, the following day, after a 'suspicious object' was found?

If you could kindly furnish me with some details, then we can contact these agencies and Irish Government departments, and so forth. After initial enquiries, the only air crash in Northern Ireland in that time frame was that of a privately-operated *Jet Provost*, on Monday the 12th. The aircraft ditched in mudflats at the mouth of the Foyle river, and it was subsequently lifted clear by an RAF-operated *Chinook*.

Thank you very much indeed for your time, and I hope that you may be able to put an end to this mystery!

I am writing with reference to your report of a sighting of an 'unidentified flying object' on 26 March 2001. The report was passed to the Ministry of Defence by Edinburgh Air Traffic Control and this office is the focal point within the MOD for correspondence relating to 'UFOs.'

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, MOD does not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported sighting. We believe it is possible that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. We could not justify expenditure of public funds on investigations which go beyond our specific defence remit.

With regard to your particular observation, I have looked back through our sighting report files and can confirm that we received no other reports of 'UFO' sightings for 26 March 2001 from anywhere in the United Kingdom. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised air activity.

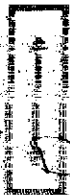
