ISSUE/SOURCE: Transport Canada's role in the reporting of unidentified aerial phenomena

DATE: May 2022

SUGGESTED RESPONSES / KEY MESSAGES

- Transport Canada Civil Aviation (TCCA) manages the Civil Aviation Daily Occurrence Reporting System (CADORS) in which unidentified aerial phenomena (UAP) are captured.
- CADORS is a publicly available database containing preliminary aviation occurrence information from which 90% of the information is from NAV Canada, the other information sources include the public, operators, airports or other involved parties.
- The role of CADORS is to supplement normal operational and functional reporting systems and investigation procedures and assign events based on the details of the occurrence.
- Assigning events to an occurrence helps to categorize occurrences in CADORS which allows for appropriate follow-up and improves TCCA's ability to analyze data.
- NAV Canada reports UAP sightings to Transport Canada (TC) in Aviation Occurrence Reports (AORs) via email. The CADORS application receives the AORs and the data is entered and made available to the public.
- Although further investigation into UAP sightings falls outside of TC's mandate, TC is open to continued collaboration with other departments and committed to the safety and security of Canada's aviation industry.

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IF PRESSED

- A briefing to the former Minister of National Defence cited in the press indicated that approximately 1000 UAP sightings are reported each year in Canada. A much smaller number than this are reported to TC from NAV Canada and captured in CADORS.
- All UAP sightings reported to TC are coded under the same event in CADORS ("Weather balloon, meteor, rocket, CIRVIS/UFO").
- A query of CADORS for the date range of 2010 to present filtered for the "Weather balloon, meteor, rocket, CIRVIS/UFO" event yielded 406 records (not all of which are UAP-related sightings).
- The occurrence information in CADORS is preliminary and subject to change.
- TC is aware of the release of various media articles on the subject of former Defence Minister briefing on UAPs ahead of the release of the US intelligence report.
- UAP reports have little to no potential for regulatory enforcement by TC due to their nature.
- Recent media articles report minimal government funding in Canada on UAP research compared to the US, and a collaborative approach to standardizing the collection of data across federal agencies is suggested.

- TC responds to regular Access to Information and Privacy (ATIP) requests involving UAP sightings for which the bulk of documents are AORs and their associated CADORS reports.
- NAV Canada reports on all occurrences that are reportable to TC via AOR's per the CADORS Manual (TP 4044).
- Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on continuing information flow and requirements between NAV Canada and Transport Canada Civil Aviation was created when NAV Canada privatized in 1996.
